At the end of every fiscal year, I am overcome with gratitude as I reflect on all that we've journeyed through as a Health Center. The dedication and expertise of our staff along with the profound impact of their work never ceases to astound me. It is a true honor to serve this organization and witness the transformative effect our programs, services, and people have in our beloved community.


This year has seen many triumphs: our inaugural class of Family Medicine Residents completed their first full year of training, and we welcomed a new class of six residents in July. Our Mobile Health Team provided healthcare in several new shelter sites where migrant families seeking asylum are staying. We brought on 47 new staff members and saw many internal promotions. I also had the enormous joy of announcing an additional end-of-year bonus for each of our staff at our June all-staff meeting. What a year it's been!

In this work we come face to face with the harsh realities experienced by our neighbors on the West Side. Earlier this summer, I was reminded of the weight of the need in our community when I came across the unmoving body of a young man in the grass. I called 911 and waited by his side until help arrived. I'm grieved to say he didn't survive, succumbing to an overdose that cut his life far too short. I wish I could have known his name and his story.

This experience had a profound impact on me, increasing my sense of the urgency of the work we are doing at LCHC. I witnessed firsthand how a person can slip through the cracks if they don't get access to the help they need. We must keep going and we must keep working together to make sure our whole community has the opportunity to thrive.

Health is now increasingly seen as the presence of wellness rather than solely the absence of illness. Our staff have wholeheartedly embraced this year's theme, *Care Together*, in the pursuit of wellness. We've chosen four focus areas: Care for One Another, Care for Self, Care for Patients, and Care for Community. The stories and statistics reported in these pages reflect their dedication and compassion. None of this would be possible without a shared purpose, reliance on each other's strengths, and our faith in God. Thank you for your continued support that uplifts, encourages, and equips us for all God has called us to.

## In Memoriam

This annual report is dedicated to the loving memory of Jerry Bolden and Carlos Rubaclava, two long serving staff members who passed away this year and will be remembered by their care for the whole Lawndale community.

To his colleagues, Jerry was a joy, singing gospel hymns first thing in the morning or leading Stevie Wonder's rendition of 'Happy Birthday.' As an employee of 24 years, Jerry was a "Good Shepherd" of patients, guiding them back to care through diligent outreach with a special heart for those living with HIV and AIDS. According to one coworker, "when he came into an exam room to meet with a patient, you could feel the Holy Spirit slipping in beside him. He loved them and they knew it. And he let them know God loved them."

Carlos' coworkers in the Pharmacy, where he served for over 13 years, describe him as more than just a colleague, but as a father figure. Carlos was looked up to as a mentor and respected as a teacher. One coworker said, "Carlos was responsible for filling prescriptions that one's life could be dependent on. His attention to detail helped avoid unnecessary complications. He was someone who solved problems you never knew existed in ways that blew your mind."

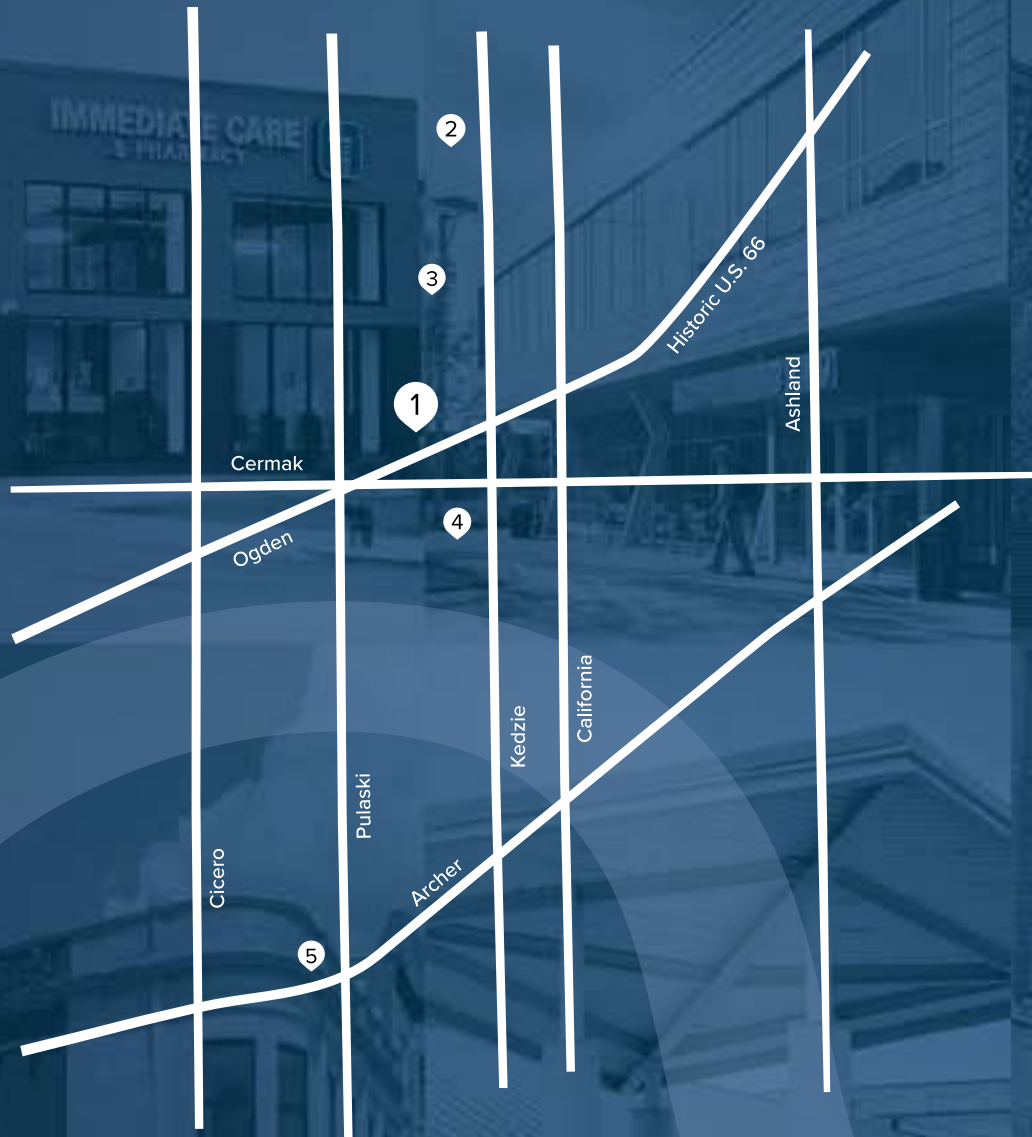

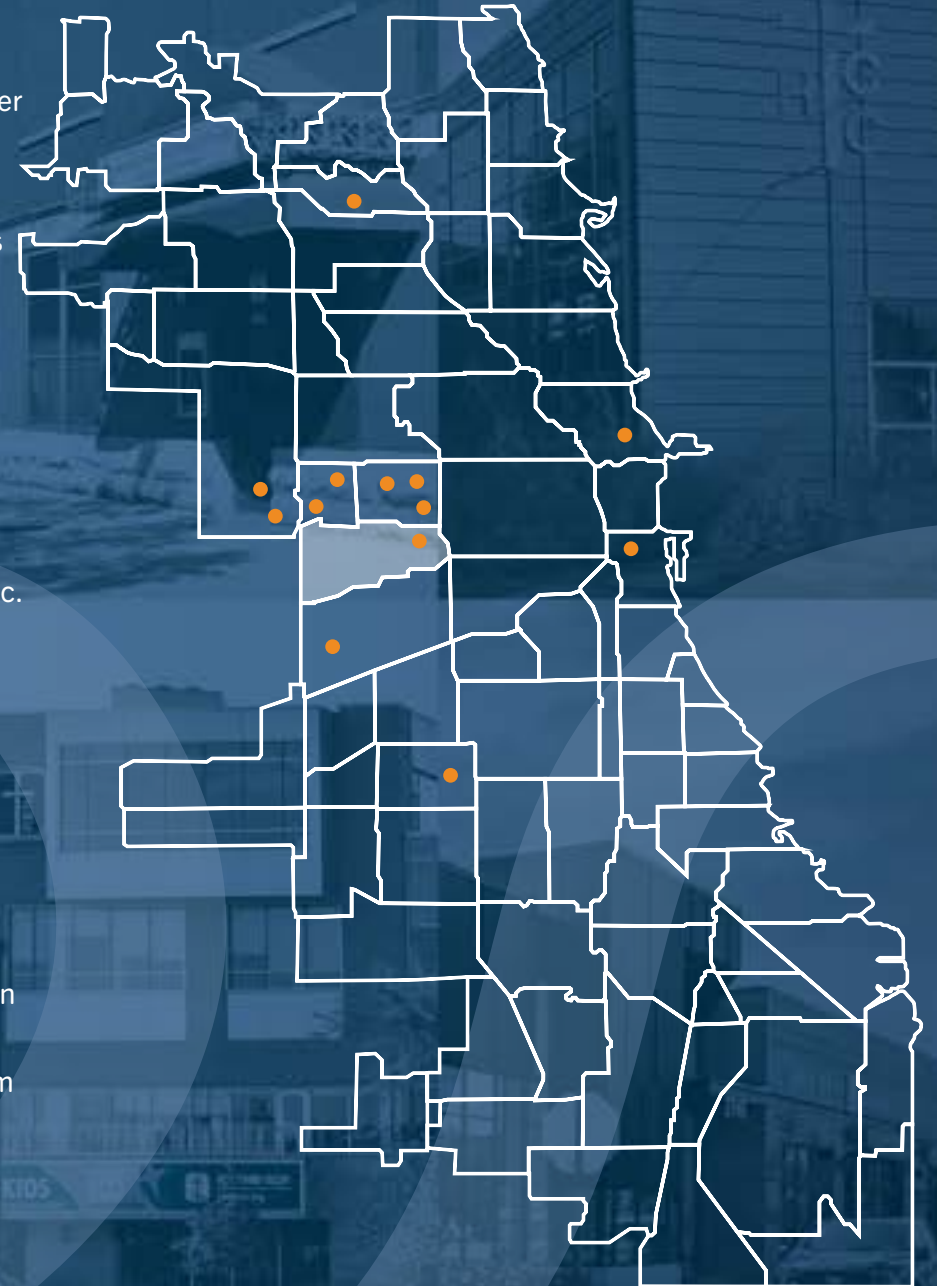

## CARE FOR ONE ANOTHER

It's a moment that LCHC staff await with bated breath each all-staff meeting. A few members of a Care Team come on stage, flowers and speeches in hand, faces glowing with anticipation for the announcement. You look over to the seats they came from to see their coworkers, mostly awash in the same excitement, but one confused face looks out. *"Why didn't I know about this?"*

Datjaeda Moore, HR Director for LCHC, hands the team members the microphone. "Veridiana Saucedo embodies all the fruits of the Spirit," is what they start to say, but all you really hear is "Veridiana Saucedo" before the crowd erupts in applause. Veridiana's face no longer shows confusion as she exchanges knowing looks with the coworkers she has served alongside for six years. She shares with them a silent, joking reprimand – that they return with mischievous grins – for going behind her back to nominate her for the Golden Touch Award.

Golden Touch Awards are given regularly to staff that have been nominated for their exceptional care by their teammates. Because each team is so heavily involved in the process and every nominee has worked so hard to support their teams, the award process often results in teams of 15 or more staff cramming onto a stage built for five to celebrate with their awardee. This June, the three recipients included: Medical Assistant Veridiana Saucedo, Referral Specialist Richard Mascorro, and Physician Assistant Bill Bush.

Kristin Andrews, LCHC's Clinic Operations Director, leads teams across all of LCHC and has helped to nominate members of her teams for the award. "It's hard to select the final awardees because everybody here has a story that brought them here, and they are so fun to hear," she shares. "Every day, we see people take a minute to help someone else. That's who we hire; that's our mission, and we look for that when we hire." Still the recognition makes a difference. "I think the ones that are most surprising to the awardee are the most memorable awards. Staff feel seen by someone they didn't think saw them working so hard for our patients."

Not everyone wins the Golden Touch Award. But as an organization, LCHC tries to incorporate appreciating staff into both everyday rituals and grand gestures, including writing thank-you cards, putting up "Caught Caring" notes around the clinic that highlight a staff person's work, sharing regular monthly birthday gatherings, and giving out the annual Founders Awards for staff with at least five years of tenure. Kristin notes that each of these habits have an impact. "These practices help staff, especially during hard times, to know that they are seen and recognized, that they can do this. That is why Golden Touch is so important – you're being recognized by all of LCHC."





## CARE FOR SELF

LCHC has a patient-centered approach to healthcare, firmly grounded in the belief that people who know how to care for themselves are healthier and happier members of their communities. The Diabetes Prevention Program is a new chronic disease management initiative that embodies this commitment. Graciela is a member of the first cohort of 15 participants who meet once a week for the entire year with trained lifestyle coaches, including Lawndale Christian Fitness Center (LCFC) Manager Jarell Kelly. With a family history of diabetes, Graciela actively embraced preventive care. “Concerns for both me and my family brought me to this program,” shared Graciela. “I even postponed a vacation! I am committed to this because I feel like I’m doing something for me for the first time. I’m taking care of myself.”

Jarell embarked on a five-week training program through the American Diabetes Association to become a certified lifestyle coach for prediabetic patients. “I think being empathetic with people on their journey is crucial. You have to meet people wherever they are in their walk of life to help them,” Jarell said, explaining his leadership approach. The program’s reach extends beyond diabetes education and offers encouragement to foster healthier habits and empower individuals like Graciela. Dr. Catherine Lin is an LCHC provider who helped bring this program to Lawndale. She notes, “There is limited time in the exam room to have an in-depth discussion of lifestyle modifications. The Diabetes Prevention Program allows the time and space for participants to learn and encourage each other on this journey.”

Integrating daily walks, attending a Saturday walking club run by LCFC in Douglass Park, and learning to cook vegetarian meals at the Farm on Ogden’s free cooking classes not only improved Graciela’s health, but also sparked a positive change within her family. “I call my family in Mexico,” she explains, “I’m telling my sisters to go and have a physical. You don’t wait to be sick.” Her children have also noticed how much more energy she has and have been inspired to make their own changes. Graciela’s older daughter schedules walks with her and her younger daughter asks for educational materials on healthy diets for her after school program.

While Graciela is motivated to take control of her health and wellbeing, she is grateful for the support she’s received from other members of the program and the coaches. She cites the friendships she’s built as one of her favorite parts of the program. Jarell says the program was intentionally designed for building community, “I think it’s best to do things in group settings where you can have a neighbor who’s going through the same thing you’re going through and struggling with some of the same things you’re struggling with. You are able to bounce ideas off each other.”

Graciela confirms this: “I have known them for not very long, but I feel like I can talk to them. They’re very friendly. I’m very pleased – you guys changed my life.”

## CARE FOR PATIENTS

Dancing is a shared passion for husband-and-wife Alfredo and Carmen Alvarez. When Alfredo started coming to LCHC for his healthcare in 2007, he didn't know the clinic would one day also be a place where he and Carmen would get to share their love of traditional Mexican folkloric dance with the seniors at LCHC's Senior Day Services program.

For over 13 years, Alfredo and Carmen have been patients of LCHC and believe it is a truly special place. "Faith is very important to us, and we immediately noticed that the doctors here were different to others we had experienced before" Carmen said, reflecting on the reasons they chose to come to Lawndale. "My first provider would even call me on the weekends to see how my medication was making me feel."

Alfredo has been able to manage his diabetes and overall health well with the support of his care team and provider, Dr. Keith So. "I feel like my health is a priority here. They remind me when I need to come in for appointments if they haven't seen me in a while. I believe this is done because I'm cared for," he says.

In addition to their medical care, Carmen and Alfredo feel that LCHC has supported their spiritual journeys through prayer and encouragement. Carmen came in once for an urgent visit, feeling nervous and overwhelmed. But after the provider prayed for her, she felt more at ease and had tranquility in her heart. The availability of scripture in clinic spaces provides added comfort and help. "I really appreciate the verses written on the white boards. I can read them as I wait and they remind me of God's love for me," Carmen shares.

During Hispanic Heritage Month in 2022, the Alvarazes and their peers from church were invited to showcase folkloric dance for the Senior Day Services program. "We were glad to be able to share our talent and our time with the seniors and be able to see them smile and have fun. It is a small way of giving a little back to the community that has helped us so much on our health journey," Alfredo said of the performance. "We were both proud and honored to celebrate our Hispanic and Mexican heritage in this way."

The Alvarazes are grateful to have found a medical home that has become so much more to them. "The providers and staff are always looking out for their patients. They care for the whole person, not just medically but spiritually," they said. "There are so many services that help us stay healthy all in one place."



# CARE FOR COMMUNITY

Chicago hosts many 5Ks each year — some emphasize extravagant themes; others are purely for fundraising. The Lawndale 5K, however, is focused on uniting the community and helping people approach fitness in an accessible way. Now in its 15th year, this annual LCHC tradition draws more than 1,500 runners and walkers each year. Robert Holt, a 23-year-old who has participated since the beginning, says of the Lawndale 5K, “In a sense, it’s kind of like a giant family reunion.” Lawndale 5K participants span all age groups, from seniors to babies that race in the baby crawl.

Brian Gannon, LCHC’s Wellness Director and organizer of the 5K, understands the importance of creating positive experiences for the community. “We know that people might have trauma in the spaces along the route. The Lawndale 5K is a way to create wonderful memories in the physical spaces, fostering healing.” Brian shares that one of his most important jobs is making sure the race is welcoming, from the youth drumline by Celestial Ministries to each year’s t-shirt design. Every aspect of the event is crucial for promoting a healthy community.

The Lawndale 5K has been grounded in community since the beginning. It was started in 2008 by a former member of Lawndale Christian Community Church’s (LCCC) Hope House recovery program, alongside LCCC’s Pastor Joe and a small group of planners. Brian vividly recalls the difficulties of the early days and the many hurdles the planning team overcame to make the 5K happen. But it was all worth it for the impact it has had on the community, including with Robert.

Robert first won the kids dash when he was seven years old. He recalls how running along a closed street made him feel very important as a little boy, “It was really nice to see the streets blocked off, and people on the sidelines cheering.” Robert has now returned to LCHC as a Mobile Health Assistant after earning a master’s in physiology. His goal is to give back to the community where he grew up.

Mirria Herred, a resident of North Lawndale and Site Manager at LCHC, hasn’t missed a single Lawndale 5K since 2008. Even when she underwent surgery last September, she still showed up to volunteer. When asked about her commitment to the event, she explains the value of fitness for overall well-being. She says a visit to the fitness center or even a short walk during a break can work wonders when she’s stressed or overwhelmed. Mirria’s joy in running alongside community members and visitors feels tangible, as is her hope that more of Chicago can see all the wonderful things happening in North Lawndale through the 5K.

This year, Mirria plans to bring her two grandsons to the Lawndale 5K, “It’s important to set a good example for our young people.” Recently, her grandchildren showed interest in joining the Fitness Center, which filled her with pride as they began to value their wellness.

Through its 15 years, the Lawndale 5K has remained an event where the community comes together to cheer each other on — from regulars like Rob, Mirria, and Brian, to each joyful neighbor that participates for the first time. It truly is an opportunity to care for community.
